

## **ALDWORTH ZOOM MEETING HELD ON 8<sup>th</sup> JULY 2020 AT 6.30 p.m.**

1. **WELCOME** to those present, from the Chairman.
2. **APOLOGIES:** Cllr N Williams
3. **DECLARATIONS** none
4. **MINUTES OF 6<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2020** were agreed and will be signed in due course.
5. **MATTERS ARISING:**
  - i) **AMBURY ROAD DRAINS.** Nothing appears to have been achieved. Clerk to contact WBC again.
  - ii) The surface of the public footpath from Batt's Barns to Kiddington Cottage has been repaired in three sections with road plainings. The council are not sure whether this material is allowed on footpaths in AONB, nor whether WBC or Yattendon Estates are aware. Clerk to contact both, for their comments.
  - iii) No reply from Gary Lugg, Senior Officer in Planning WBC. Clerk to write to him again regarding Westridge Manor proposed solar panels.
  - iv) Cllr Roach has met with Stuart Clark, chief engineer at WBC, and the contractor concerned, to survey the areas of road which flood, primarily the bend on the Streatley side of Westridge and also further along the B4009 towards Streatley, and on the Ashampstead to Bradfield Road. Ditch clearance has already taken place at the latter site. Work should begin before long on the others.
  - v) There has still been no response from WBC planning department regarding the possible breach at Kiddington Cottage.
6. **DOG FOULING SIGNS** have been installed by the Chairman at footpath Westridge to Aldworth.
7. **CAR PARKING AT AMBURY ROAD,** Aldworth. No room for Emergency vehicles. Clerk to write to the District Council.
8. A short section of fence by the footpath from the Bell to Westridge will be removed in the autumn once the crop has been cut.
9. Pibworth sign has not yet been re-installed. Clerk to chase,
10. **FINANCE:** a) Accounts for y/e 30/3/2020 have been completed and despatched to PKF LLP in London. b) Balance at Bank £12,973.60 c) Clerk reminded Council that a contribution to her Broadband had been due since 1<sup>st</sup> April. A sum of £8.33 per month was agreed. It was in the Budget.
